Objective

To make it easy to identify what can and can't be hacked, what should be thrown out, and items to be left switched on.

Limitations

This procedure doesn't cover tools so if it looks like a tool Dont Hack it, clean it and put it somewhere sensible.

It doesn't override your responsibility to act as a good community member so protection labels will be void for materials stored;

- unsafely,
- so as to obstruct others use of the space,
- or if the space gets too full.

Colours and Protection Life

Blue, Green, Red, and Yellow, Labels

One colour will;
be applied during one quarter,
provide protection for a further 6 months
may be removed by anyone after that

Label Calendar

Violet Labels

Provide permanent protection and must only be used for Hackspace materials e.g. the contents of Hackspace workshop boxes.

White Labels

To be used for storage where the timing provided by one of the coloured labels is not appropriate. White labels must be dated when applied.

Material must be stored safely on the project box rack in G11 or the sheet material rack in G10.

Usage:

These labels were set up to protect Hackspace workshop boxes e.g. the cardboard modeling box. Members may use items protected by one of these labels but tools must be returned and used / damaged items replaced.
These labels must not be used on Members material.

Colour: Blue, Green, Red, or Yellow

Label Size: 63.5mm x 72mm coloured adhesive labels similar to Avery L7164

Printed Text:

Hack Me
Before <April|June|October|January> 1st
May be thrown out at any time

These labels are a guide to what to throw out when the hack me shelves become full. They must be attached to all hackable material when accepted into hackspace. Material must be stored safely on the Hackme shelf in G11.

These use gLabels to print black text on white blank labels
disposal.glabels

Information to be added:

Earliest date for disposal usually 1 month after the label is applied.

Usage:

These are to be attached to any significant items to be thrown out.

The items should be placed on the on the way out shelves, the top two shelves on the rack above the Bins in G11.

Items should normally be given one month on the on the way out shelves before disposal.

These labels are intended to stop stuff that is wanted by one member being thrown out by another.

Colour: Blue, Green, Yellow, or Red

Label Size and type: 38mm x 21mm white self adhesive labels similar to Avery L7651

Printed Text:

Until <April|June|October|January> 1st

Considerate behavior

There are legitimate reasons for not attending hackspace or answering emails e.g. extended hospitalisation, so:

Try to contact the owner before removing an expired label.

If you can't contact the owner for for significant items, extend the protection by part covering the old label with a new one and writing "Couldn't contact owner " on it.

if you see someone else's label falling off, stick it back on again or replace it.

If you start the last sheet of labels order some more

If you use a lot of labels put a donation in the tin.

Coloured labels cost around 3p each

White labels cost around 5p each

Coloured / White labels

The decision to print black on coloured labels or black & background on white labels was based on the estimated volume of blank labels required.

The anticipated volume of violet & plug top labels was low so the background colour is printed so need a colour printer.

Scrap board big enough to take a label with a hole & string. to be used on items with no flat surface to fix a label.
